Introduction

The photo of animals in this book are camera trap images except for few images. The camera traps were set up technically to capture tiger. However, several large and medium mammals were captured. This booklet contains 34 species of mammals and it is definitely not the exhaustive list of mammals in Jomotsangkha Wildlife Sanctuary. In the coming year, a survey will be carried out to determine presence of small mammals in the park.

This pictorial book is the first official record of mammals in the park. Although the park is small in terms of area, there are several charismatic mammal species such as tiger, elephant gaur and seven species of cat species. In the meantime, this baseline data is important for preparation of conservation management plan.




